### From a principal's perspective.

The day a race never started, yet a race came to an end.

Little did I know that on Thursday 19 January I would meet Charlotte's autistic brother for the first time. I would watch Charlotte line up for her 60m race while daddy was standing at the 50m mark ready to support his daughter.

I watched Charlotte line up for the 60m race while her daddy was standing next to the field to support her.

I would have never expected to walk over to a wife seated in a car with my wife, to go and break the news that her husband had passed away.

I will never forget the moment when Bernadette's entire being collapsed in my arms as I broke the news.

On Thursday the 19th of January I saw an entire community come together in prayer. Teachers and parents surrounded us while we attended to Chad.

I visited Bernadette at her home and got to meet the entire family. During my visit, someone asked the question: "I wonder why God would have allowed this to happen right there, next to a school's sports field, surrounded by so much people, at a public school in a public space.

Only then it struck me, God allowed this to imprint Chad's Legacy in the community of Centurion.

For many people, legacy is a statue after someone has passed away. But in the opinion of Michael W Smith, legacy is the mark you leave in people's lives after you've passed away. In this case, Chad's legacy will live on in Bernadette and Charlotte and in his family members.

Chad passed away while being next to a sports field supporting his daughter, while other fathers and mothers have never seen their children participate. Chad was present, actively involved. I even noticed that Charlottes parents were the first parents to sign the attendance register at our Parent evening last week. They are just actively present in Charlotte's life.

This is what Chad's legacy did, it single-handedly united 4 schools in Centurion. That is more or less 3000 children and 3000 families.

Chad was the reason for 4 different schoolteachers taking hands while standing in a big circle and they all started to pray. Teachers that have turned their backs on God. I've had a week filled with phone calls from principals and teachers requesting me to lead them back to God.

On Friday morning at Entheos we started the day with a free worship session where I saw kids lying flat on their backs worshiping and ministering to each other. I saw children come back to God as the reality of Chad's death coming unexpectedly made us all aware that death is something we can not plan.

My wife was next to Bernadette during it all. And when we left my wife told me what Bernadette told her that: "He was just the best husband" ...." He always treated me with respect" ......" He never raised his voice to me" ........ and ........" I never told him today that I love him".

You see family and friends, as much as Chad will never walk with us again. I think it only fair to say that looking back at the mark that he has left in all our lives, we can come to the sensible conclusion that Chad really lived his life to the full. That is something that we can celebrate today.
